Talk is Cheap, Not for Long!.....The New Jersey Senate on February 27th approved a bill that would strengthen the state's ban on using hand-held cell phones while driving. The bill, approved 34-0, would make driving while talking on a cell phone a primary offense, meaning that police could write a ticket even if the driver had done nothing else wrong. The bill passed the Senate, 39-0, in December, but the

Man tries to rob FBI coffee shop

Is Andrew Johnson fearless or just senseless? The Ohio man allegedly attempted a daring robbery of a coffee shop inside an office building in Toledo that also housed the FBI. According to Toledo Police spokesperson, Capt. Diana Ruiz-Krause, Johnson, 34, entered the store at about 8:10 a.m. on July 25, 2005 and pretended to be an employee. He walked behind the store's counter and removed \$165 from the cash register. A store manager confronted Johnson and the two men began to struggle. When the thief attempted to escape by jumping over the counter, he was tackled by an FBI agent and other customers who were waiting on line. Several other FBI agents rushed down from their offices to help subdue Johnson, who surrendered when he realized that he was outnumbered, Ruiz said. When Toledo police arrived to arrest Johnson, the suspect thrashed around, uttered obscenities and kicked out the window of a squad car. Officers had to use pepper spray to restrain him. Johnson was charged with robbery and felony vandalism, and was taken to the Lucas County Jail.
